The Karuk Tribe requests proposals for the following Scope of Work required for facilitation of cultural activities suitable for tribal families. The purpose of the activities is to strengthen cultural awareness, teaching and providing information/education related to tribal practices that promote healing, and providing healthy alternative activities for Karuk children, youth and families.

Task One – Activity/Event Development of Goals and Curriculum

Contractor will coordinate with Human Services Clinical Staff to develop, schedule and design activities appropriate to traditional tribal life ways and healing.

Task Two - Facilitation of Activity/Event per Goals Developed

Provision of one or more Cultural Activities which may include any of the following: necklace design and construction, storytelling, language, basket making/gathering of materials, traditional foods or medicinal materials gathering. Instruction or demonstration of preparation of indigenous foods, traditional card games or ceremony protocol. Some activities may be gender specific. Interested parties may respond to one or more of the activities.

Contractor is responsible for scheduling, preparation and facilitation of activities. Contractor shall also coordinate and plan activities with the Human Services staff. Location of activities will be within the Tribe's service area. Contractor will coordinate with Human Services staff to collect data necessary to meet grant requirements. Contractor shall submit to a Department of Justice background check.
