Draft Finding of No Significant Impact

In accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), codified at 42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq., a Draft Environmental Assessment has been prepared for providing Federal financial assistance to the Karuk Tribe. The project is subject to NEPA review because it is being funded, in part, with Federal funding available from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance.

Proposed Action

The Karuk Tribe's project is a proposed construction of a 2,800 square foot factory built modular facility that will house the Tribal Court and wellness center.

Location

The project site, which is largely vacant and undeveloped, is part of the Karuk Tribe's trust lands, located at 1221 Thook Street.

Finding

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance has determined that the construction of the facility would not significantly affect the quality of the human or physical environment. It is not expected that an environmental impact statement will be prepared for this project.
