Seeking Interested Tribal Members

Deadline: February 24, 2023 by 5pm

The Karuk Tribe Housing Authority (KTHA) is currently accepting Letters/Applications from Enrolled Members of the Karuk Tribe to serve on the KTHA Board of Commissioners (BOC).

There are two (2) vacancies for full four-year terms ending in 2027.

Letters/Applications are welcomed from any of the three Council Districts as outlined below. In accordance with the KTHA Ordinance, as vacancies arise, preference shall be given to maintain equal representation from all districts, specifically 2 Orleans, 2 Yreka, and 2 Happy Camp.

1. The Orleans (Panámniik) District, which shall draw its membership from the towns and surrounding areas of Orleans, Weitchpec/Hoopa, Somes Bar, Forks of Salmon/Sawyers Bar, Weaverville, Crescent City, Klamath, McKinleyville, Arcata, Eureka, Fortuna, and Rio Dell.
2. The Happy Camp (Athithúfvuunupma) District, which shall draw its membership from the towns and surrounding areas of Happy Camp, Seiad Valley, Klamath River, Scott Bar, O'Brien, Cave Junction, and Grants Pass.
3. The Yreka (Kahtishraam) District, which shall draw its membership from the towns and surrounding areas of Yreka, Montague, Fort Jones, Etna, Hornbrook, Ashland, Talent, Phoenix, Medford, and Central Point.

The mission of the Karuk Tribe Housing Authority is to *acquire and maintain assets. KTHA will strive to alleviate the acute shortage of decent, safe and sanitary dwellings for Native American persons of low and moderate income. KTHA will promote and sustain the culture, education, language, health, welfare, self-sufficiency, and economic independence of its residents. Affordable housing services shall include rental, home ownership, and model programs.*

The Board meets at least twice monthly, usually on Mondays during business hours. The meeting locations rotate between Yreka, Happy Camp, and Orleans. Board Members are expected to travel as necessary to attend meetings, trainings, and conferences. Board Members are compensated with stipends for their time at regular Board of Commissioner Meetings, special meetings, while traveling for official KTHA related business, and for participating on interview panels. Mileage is paid when required.

Applications are available online and will be accepted by **Brittany Souza until 5pm on February 24, 2023.**
